



STUDIES 27–30: ADDED-FINGER SLIDES

Added-finger slides are easily done when a melody is descending. You approach the note in question melodically from above and slide up into it from below. It is possible to invert this—to approach a note melodically from below and slide down into it from above—but it is difficult and is rarely done in the tradition. These studies address only the former.

The additional finger to use for each slide is indicated below the notehead.
